### GOAL

*In 2018 Bay Aging will be celebrating its 40th anniversary—40 years where staff have consistently delivered quality services!* With the goal of helping people—no matter what age—live independently for as long as possible, Bay Aging helps people live healthier with meals, personal care, transportation, affordable housing, home repairs and more.

### TRENDS

By 2020, 38% of people living in the Northern Neck and 30% of Middle Peninsula residents will be 60 and older—a 5 to 6% increase from 2010. As generations age, they impact the types of services in demand—health, transportation and housing. Social risk factors, which are interconnected, significantly impact one’s ability to meet their own needs and the needs of their family. The top four needs that emerged through multiple community-wide needs assessments are:

- 1) housing
- 2) transportation
- 3) health
- 4) employment

# IMPACT

- ◆ **1,323 seniors** are living healthier and safer in their own homes because **volunteers provided friendly visits while delivering 168,774 meals**
- ◆ **1,143 people of all ages** are effectively addressing their wellness, care and chronic disease management, staying out of the hospital longer and saving money on health care costs by receiving **145,717 hours of care services**
- ◆ **15,023 people** were able to make better decisions and improve their lives through counseling, education, employment training and other services
- ◆ **138,487 rides throughout the region** gave people of all ages a variety of ways to access work, health care, education/training, and an array of consumer goods and services
- ◆ **270 seniors call one of nine senior apartment communities—located on the Middle Peninsula and Northern Neck—home** where they live in comfortable, energy efficient homes; residents also benefit from receiving support services such as meals, home care or transportation to ensure they can continue living on their own longer
- ◆ **137 people (55% are 62 years+)** now live in **79 homes** made safer through home repairs, weatherized for energy efficiency, or rehabilitated/reconstructed
- ◆ **387 families of all ages** are living in safe, affordable housing via the Housing Choice Voucher Program
- ◆ **863 dedicated volunteers** provided **31,304 hours of service** to improve the lives of homebound seniors through friendly visits and meal deliveries

## **Impact of Leveraging \$112,018 County and Town Donations**

Bay Aging is proud to promote positive economic impact by utilizing local businesses and forming partnerships to improve lives.

- ◆ **286 Middle Peninsula and Northern Neck citizens** employed by Bay Aging
- ◆ **\$6,714,768 = value of services**
- ◆ **Every \$1 donated leveraged \$60 in services** delivered in the Middle Peninsula and Northern Neck
