GOAL

In 2018 Bay Aging will be celebrating its 40th anniversary—40 years where staff have consistently delivered quality services! With the goal of helping people—no matter what age—live independently for as long as possible, Bay Aging helps people live healthier with meals, personal care, transportation, affordable housing, home repairs and more.

TRENDS

By 2020, 38% of people living in the Northern Neck and 30% of Middle Peninsula residents will be 60 and older—a 5 to 6% increase from 2010. As generations age, they impact the types of services in demand—health, transportation and housing. Social risk factors, which are interconnected, significantly impact one’s ability to meet their own needs and the needs of their family. The top four needs that emerged through multiple community-wide needs assessments are:

- 1) housing
- 2) transportation
- 3) health
- 4) employment

As you turn the page, you will discover how Bay Aging Board of Directors, leadership and staff addressed these needs and their significant outcomes.

IMPACT

- ◆ **120 seniors** are living healthier and safer in their own homes because **volunteers provided friendly visits while delivering 15,574 meals**
- ◆ **135 people of all ages** are effectively addressing their wellness, care and chronic disease management, staying out of the hospital longer and saving money on health care costs by receiving **17,019 hours of care services**
- ◆ **1,308 people** were able to make better decisions and improve their lives through counseling, education, employment training and other services
- ◆ **9,717 rides** gave people of all ages access to work, health care, education/training, and an array of consumer goods and services
- ◆ **69 people** now live in homes made safer through home repairs or weatherized for energy efficiency
- ◆ **42 seniors** call Port Town Village home where they live in comfortable, energy efficient homes; residents also benefit from receiving support services such as meals, home care or transportation to ensure they can continue living on their own longer
- ◆ **5 low-income families live** in Housing Choice Voucher Program homes (Section 8) where a safe and healthy environment is key to raising a family and maintaining good, attractive housing stock in the community
- ◆ **64 dedicated volunteers** provided **1,605 hours of service** to improve the lives of homebound seniors through friendly visits and meal deliveries

A recent widow, Mrs. R. was in general very frightened about her future as her husband took care of most things. First she needed help getting the finances straight, which the Middlesex senior center director helped her do. A few weeks later—on a rainy day—she again sought out the senior center director because her roof was leaking. The director talked with Bay Aging’s housing staff about Mrs. R’s housing repair need. Housing staff, center director and Mrs. R. worked together to coordinate all the paperwork that is required for housing repair projects. And within three weeks of approval the housing crew was installing a completely new roof on her home! Mrs. R. is so appreciative. The senior center director shared that, “Mrs. R. was beaming when she came in to the center. She hugged me and said, “Thank you so much. You have done more to help me in one month than I’ve been able to get done in one year!”

Impact of Leveraging \$6,916 MIDDLESEX County Donation

Bay Aging is proud to promote positive economic impact by utilizing local businesses and forming partnerships to improve lives.

- ◆ 97 Bay Aging Employees work in Middlesex and an additional 14 live in the county but commute out to other Bay Aging locations.
- ◆ \$681,490 = value of services
- ◆ Every \$1 donated leveraged \$98.54 in services delivered in Middlesex County

Impact of Leveraging \$36,168 Public Transportation Dollars and \$36,168 Pilot Grant from River Counties Community Foundation

- ◆ \$134,338 leveraged in State and Federal funds

Additional Revenue to Middlesex County

- ◆ \$16,702 Port Town Village real estate tax to Middlesex County
