### GOAL

*In 2018 Bay Aging will be celebrating its 40th anniversary—40 years where staff have consistently delivered quality services!* With the goal of helping people—no matter what age—live independently for as long as possible, Bay Aging helps people live healthier with meals, personal care, transportation, affordable housing, home repairs and more.

### TRENDS

By 2020, 38% of people living in the Northern Neck and 30% of Middle Peninsula residents will be 60 and older—a 5 to 6% increase from 2010. As generations age, they impact the types of services in demand—health, transportation and housing. Social risk factors, which are interconnected, significantly impact one's ability to meet their own needs and the needs of their family. The top four needs that emerged through multiple community-wide needs assessments are:

- 1) housing
- 2) transportation
- 3) health
- 4) employment

# IMPACT

- ◆ **66 seniors** are living healthier and safer in their own homes because **volunteers provided friendly visits while delivering 6,803 meals**
- ◆ **19 people of all ages** are effectively addressing their wellness, care and chronic disease management, staying out of the hospital longer and saving money on health care costs by receiving **1,343 hours of care services**
- ◆ **32 seniors call Winters Point home** where they live in comfortable, energy efficient homes; residents also benefit from receiving support services such as meals, home care or transportation to ensure they can continue living on their own longer
- ◆ **3,317 rides** (does not include King William County) gave people of all ages access to work, health care, education/training, and an array of consumer goods and services
- ◆ **5 low-income families live** in Housing Choice Voucher Program homes (Section 8) where a safe and healthy environment is key to raising a family and maintaining good, attractive housing stock in the community
- ◆ **26 dedicated volunteers** provided **562 hours of service** to improve the lives of homebound seniors through friendly visits and meal deliveries

## **Impact of Leveraging \$2,500 for Meals on Wheels Town of West Point Donation**

Bay Aging is proud to promote positive economic impact by utilizing local businesses and forming partnerships to improve lives.

- ◆ \$87,507 = value of services
- ◆ Every \$1 donated leveraged \$35.00 in services delivered in the Town of West Point

## **Impact of Leveraging \$20,675 Public Transportation Dollars**

- ◆ \$38,396 leveraged in State and Federal funds
  - ◆ \$15,000 match by King William County leveraged \$27,857 leveraged in State and Federal funds

## **Additional Revenue to King William County**

- ◆ \$9,244 Winters Point real estate tax to the Town of West Point
  - ◆ \$5,200 real estate tax to King William County
- ◆ \$1,993—water for Winters Point
- ◆ \$5,531—sewer for Winters Point
