# Community Impact Report

## Moving the Town of West Point Forward

Some data includes King William County

We believe a healthy community consists of numerous vital conditions—*basic needs for health and safety, good education for all, meaningful work and financial security, humane housing, healthy environment, reliable transportation, community partnerships and social supports people need to thrive.* Bay Aging is proud to contribute to the economic vitality of the communities we serve by partnering with county leaders, community organizations, and local businesses to leverage services for community good.



## BAY HEALTH

A DIVISION OF BAY AGING

Bay Aging leveraged \$2,500 for Meals on Wheels with other funding to deliver \$88,076 in services.

- 44 seniors are living healthier lives in their own homes because volunteers delivered them 6,415 nutritious meals
- 120 people of all ages benefitted from home and personal care, adult day care, veterans directed care, senior employment training, insurance counseling, and options counseling. Home and personal care services included wellness checks, and education about chronic disease care management, which is helping to keep them out of the hospital longer and saving on health costs

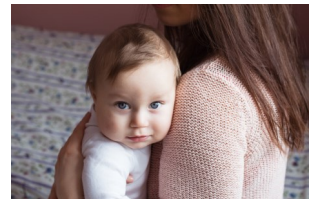


## BAY HOUSING

A DIVISION OF BAY AGING

Bay Aging delivered \$175,027 in housing services.

- 16 people are living in 6 safe, decent and affordable homes in the Town of West Point through the Housing Choice Voucher Program
- 38 seniors benefitted from living in safe, affordable homes at Winters Point senior apartment community; residents also receive support services that allow them to live independently longer



## BAY TRANSIT

A DIVISION OF BAY AGING

Bay Aging leveraged \$20,675 from the Town of West Point and \$20,675 from King William County with \$76,792 in state and federal funds to provide \$118,142 in transportation services.

- 7,272 total rides
  - 2,753 in-town West Point
  - 4,519 throughout King William County
- 30% of total ridership for people to go to work
- Residents also used Bay Transit to access health care, education, polling places, retail and other town and county services

### OTHER ECONOMIC IMPACTS:

15 Bay Aging employees live in King William County and/or work in the county

\$9,244 real estate tax revenue to the Town of West Point and \$3,983 to King William County

\$7,313 to the Town of West Point for water and sewer
